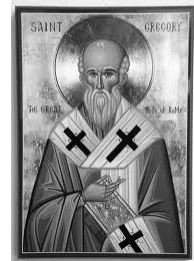

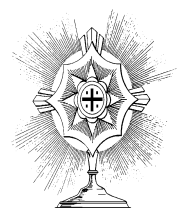

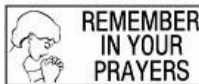

Welcome Iglesia de Santa Cruz de la Canada, priests, sister, parishioners, and staff welcome all those that are visiting our church as well as our newly registered families: **Francisco, Rose Padilla & family.** May your life be touched, and inspired as we give praise and worship to Our Lord through the power of Holy Spirit.

TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: When Peter answered Jesus’ question with, “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God,” his understanding of what this meant was limited. Like most of the people of his day, Peter was expecting a Messiah (or “Anointed One”) who would be a military leader sent to restore God’s people to the glory they had when David was king. So when Jesus starts talking about having to suffer greatly and be killed, Peter takes Jesus aside and rebukes him. Jesus explodes. Peter, last week called a rock, has become an obstacle to the Father’s plan, no longer thinking like God but only as humans do. For this reason, Jesus says to him, “Get behind me, Satan!” That is, “Peter, you stumbling block, don’t block me. Follow me. “To walk with Jesus means to follow him along the way, taking up the cross, losing one’s life for his sake. Those who follow will be willing to “offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God.” making them their “spiritual worship.” This is the sacrificial life that comes from working for justice, caring for the poor and vulnerable, forgiving enemies. **Do you choose to follow him?**

RCIA Many people say they know someone who has left the Catholic Church to become *Christian*. The Catholic Church **IS** the Catholic Christian Church. . .it is the **first Christian Church** begun by **Jesus himself!** Jesus commanded his apostles to lead others through his death and resurrection to a baptism through the *Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit*. The Catholic Church continues to be guided **by the Holy Spirit!** Jesus promised that **the gates of hell will not prevail against MY church** and for 2000 years, Jesus has been faithful to that promise in spite of her member's shortcomings and failures. So, we are **Catholic Christians**.


Our journey of faith in the Catholic Church is blessed by the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults—RCIA—which began in the early 1980's as a way of getting back to the way the first Christians received instruction before they were baptized. RCIA has taken on the responsibility of preparing adults and children for Baptism, as well as adults who come from **another** Christian faith who want to profess the Catholic faith. Catholics who have been baptized but have not received First Communion or Confirmation are also prepared for these sacraments in RCIA.

We meet at the Religious Education Center every Wednesday from 7-9 pm and each weekly session enables us to ask questions, study Scripture and learn more about what Jesus teaches **through HIS church**. We invite adults who would like to complete their sacraments of initiation to come to RCIA. We also invite parishioners who want to grow in their Catholic Christian faith to come to RCIA this or any Wednesday.

This Wednesday we will learn about **Christian Love and Responsibility**. As Christians, WE ARE THE CHURCH. We are **commissioned by Jesus through our Baptism** to do the work of God. Each week we gather around the table of the Lord to receive *His Body and His Blood* to go out and to be the face of Jesus in our home and community. This is a huge responsibility and the only way we can do this is by staying united with Jesus in His Church, the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church.

When we see economic injustice, racism, sexism, media exploitation of the human person, failed leadership—school, local, community, state, national and world levels—we are called to **speak out against it and work to eliminate it**. We have to help each other to eliminate the shortcomings which “get in the way of our becoming a universal (catholic) sacrament of salvation.”(Darring)

“We must serve the Church and love her as she is, with a clear understanding of history, and humbly searching for the will of God who assists and guides her even when at times He permits human weakness to eclipse the purity of her features and the beauty of her action. It is this purity and beauty which we are endeavoring to discover and promote.” (Pope Paul VI, Ecclesiam Suam)
