FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Today Jesus is presented as a prophet like Moses, a prophet whom Moses promised that God would raise up and about whom God said, “I will put my words into his mouth.” This prophet would deliver God’s message, speaking definitely in God’s name. Mark presents Jesus as the one who fulfills that promise by his teaching with an authority that makes people marvel. Then, in this first act of casting out an evil spirit, we see the kingdom of God breaking into our world. By naming Jesus as the “Holy One of God,” the evil spirit tries to take control over Jesus, but for naught. Jesus silences the spirit and calls him out of the man. He restores the man to himself. God’s power to confront and overcome evil is at hand. The power of evil has been overcome by the death and resurrection of Jesus. **What “unclean spirits” continue to take up residence in our world today? Do we trust the power of Jesus to vanquish them? Do we welcome the power of God into our lives or have we become comfortable when other powers wish to possess us?**

RCIA

The Healing Power of Jesus is our teaching in RCIA on Wednesday. We, the community of believers, the members of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church, have been called to bring healing to others. Our world is experiencing so much suffering and we, through prayer **and** action, can discern how we can go about offering healing to those in need. We can be open to offering healing by:

- volunteering in our San Martin de Porres Soup Kitchen**
- volunteering in our schools to help children struggling with reading and math**
- volunteering in our church’s teaching ministry with youth and adults**
- volunteering in a battered women’s shelter or a homeless shelter**
- volunteering in hospitals and nursing homes**
- visiting the elderly and helping them with:**

- taking them for groceries or for their doctor’s appointments*
- helping them bring wood in for their fireplaces*
- helping them clean their yards & their homes if they need help*
- helping them by fixing a meal for them occasionally (or even weekly)*
- making sure they are safe in their homes*

Jesus healed Peter’s mother-in-law and so many more who were brought to him. After preaching the Good News to the people, Jesus would go off by himself to pray so that he could be renewed. The apostles and others followed him because there were so many needs and they wanted Jesus to continue healing more people. This, too, is our experience. So many people need our help, and so we are called to pray that God might lead us to help those who most need us.

To be able to heal and offer Jesus’ peace to others, we need to have prayer in our lives. We need quiet moments away from the crowds to figure out who we are and what we are called to do for Jesus. We need to set time aside to turn to God and to seek Jesus’ presence, to renew ourselves and to grow in friendship and unity with him.

John Henry Newman wrote this prayer which is so perfect for each of us to remember our call:

*“God has created me to do him some definite service’
 He has committed some work to me which he has not committed to another.
 I have my mission. . .I am a link in a chain, a band of connection between persons.
 He has not created me for nought.
 I shall do good. I shall do his work.
 If I am in sickness, my sickness may serve him; in perplexity, my perplexity may serve him
 If I am in sorrow, my sorrow may serve him.
 He does nothing in vain.
 He knows what he is about. AMEN.*

The Catholic Church challenges us to *hunger and thirst for what is right*, so that, like God, we might *fill the hungry with good things*. (Darring) “The Catholic Church continues Jesus’ healing ministry through the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick among those who suffer and who face death. This sacrament can bring us into the powerful presence of the Lord who heals our broken spirits, strengthens us in the face of fears, gives us peace to endure suffering on our life’s journey. Through celebration of this sacrament, we can better understand the meaning of dying and rising, we can grow in our hope of resurrection beyond death, can deepen our trust in God’s great, gentle care and compassionate love for each of us.” (Clare M. Colella)

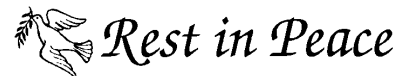

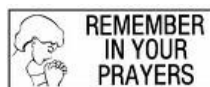
