SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: A leper in Jesus’ day was completely cut off from family, friends, and the world, excluded from any participation in social or religious events. The assumption was that lepers had sinned in some way, and therefore could not enter the Temple or synagogue because they were unworthy to worship God. Except for the company of other lepers, they faced isolation and life in deserted places. The Law of Moses commanded lepers to drive others away by shouting, “Unclean, unclean.” For Jesus to touch a leper was to make himself unclean. Can you imagine, then, how this leper must have felt when Jesus “stretched out his hand, touched him.” And how his heart must have warmed at Jesus’ words: “I do will it. Be made clean.” Jesus’ compassion took precedence over the law, although Jesus’ respect for the law is revealed when he commands the leper to show himself to the priest. But even this was out of compassion, for the leper needed verification by the priest to return to the community. **Can we say, as Paul did, “Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ,” especially in imitation of the Lord’s compassion for the outcasts in our society?**

RCIA *“Very truly, I tell you. . . unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit” (Jn 12:24).* Lent is that period in our Liturgical Calendar which gives us an opportunity to “die to ourselves” so that we “can rise with Jesus” at Easter. One way we can plan for our Lenten journey is to think about how God sees us. Then, we can think back over this past year and evaluate our lives in each of these areas:

- Your health—what are your concerns. . . are you grateful for good health?
- Your relationship with your family and friendsw.
- Your relationship with God.
- Your relationship with your parish family and your church.
- Your relationship with your neighbors, your town, your community.
- Your relationships at work or school.
- Your financial needs, your blessings, your worries.
- Your educational progress in school, in your faith walk.
- Your sense of peace.

Lent is a special time given to us by the Church where we look at Jesus’ teachings and all of his life in the light of his passion and death. We also see what his passion and death means for our salvation and how, by learning from his example and following his teachings, we fulfill our baptismal commitment and **make progress toward salvation**. Lent is a time to renew our lives, to let God renew our heart.

Jesus calls us as his followers to engage in these three spiritual practices: **FASTING, PRAYER AND ALMSGIVING (works of charity)**. When we pray, we are strengthened to fast and we deepen our desire to be charitable. When we fast, we soften our hearts to be charitable and we quiet our spirit for prayer. When we perform works of charity, it gives our fasting purpose and allows us to concentrate on our prayer.

“They devoted themselves to the apostles’ teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers” (Acts 2:41). The greatest prayer is the Mass. It supports everything we believe. Lent calls us to commit to making prayer a daily practice, especially with our families. Reading spiritual books during Lent will also help us keep the spirit of Lent within us.

“Anna never left the temple, but worshiped there with fasting and prayer night and day” (Lk 2:37). Fasting means consuming less. Abstinence means avoiding certain things, like meat or television or unnecessary computer time or too much shopping. Fasting disciplines the body to rely less on the things of this world and to rely more on God. We can also fast from bad habits in the hope that we can rid them from our lives forever.

“And now faith, hope and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love” (1 Cor 13:13). Almsgiving is the practice of giving money or goods to the poor. We remember the poor widow in Luke 21 who gave a small amount—all she had—as a way for us to remember we have been blessed beyond measure and we are called to **share our blessings with others**. We are called to share not only our blessings, but our time and talents also to help build others up. Lent is a good time to do this.

Our faith teaches us that Jesus was willing to die for us! We confess this truth every time we pray the Creed in Church. *“I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God. . . for us men and for our salvation. . . for our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, suffered death and was buried.”* The Church gives us this amazing time of Lent to remember all Jesus has done for us so that we can “get back on track” on our faith journey. We can all say, “. . . as for me and my house, we will serve the LORD”(Josh 24:15).

RCIA WILL MEET AT MARIAN HALL FOR ASH WEDNESDAY MASS. Today, we will celebrate the Rite of Sending. This Rite allows our church to affirm and then “send” those who have been faithfully studying in RCIA to meet the Archbishop for his blessing during the final weeks of preparation. 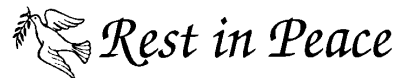
