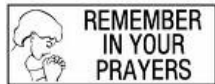

**SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:** It all sounds so improbable, if not impossible: “Be holy, for I, the Lord, your God, am holy.” “You are the Temple of God and the Spirit of God dwells in you.” “If someone hits you on your right cheek, offer him your left. If anyone wants your shirt, give him your coat. Love your enemies. Be perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect.” I remember once reading that holiness is wholeness. Being whole or complete, being holy, can only come from God. With God at work within us and through us, we can be whole, and therefore holy. With the Holy Spirit at work in us, something that we believe began at Baptism, we can be holy; we can be what God wants us to be. We eventually realize we do not belong to ourselves, but, as Paul writes to his contentious Corinthians, we belong to Christ and Christ belongs to God. The sign of the cross we make at the beginning and end of every Mass reminds us that we live with the life of the Trinity. The Trinity works in and through us, loving others.

**RCIA** Do we live a “*Materialistic or Gospel Lifestyle?*” This is our teaching on Wednesday before we begin the **Lenten Season**. God loves us so much and we sometimes have trouble accepting his love. We sometimes act like we are lost, frantically searching and anxiously worrying over our situation in life, so concerned about money and other materialistic things.

Yet, we are shown so much care by Jesus—more care than even the flowers which bloom brilliantly and only live a short time. You remind us that you care for us more than “. . .*the lilies of the field*. . .” What you ask of us is that we set our priorities in life and trust in your care. Our first priority in life is to seek first the kingdom of God and seek it with all our heart. Then, when worry and anxiety come, we can have the proper perspective to deal with our problems.

Our understanding about life helps us realize that there are five levels of life we can experience:

- First: inanimate life—rocks, dirt. . .*
- 2<sup>nd</sup>: plant life*
- 3<sup>rd</sup>: animal life*
- 4<sup>th</sup>: human life*
- 5<sup>th</sup>: spiritual life*

So, God is calling us to share in this gift of life, with our aim to be attaining the spirituality which he gives us. And yet, we remain at such a human level not realizing that we are made for God and God is within us through his Holy Spirit. We have to be constantly working toward that spirituality for which Jesus is our perfect example.

Paul teaches us in 1 Corinthians that we are servants of Christ and stewards of the mystery of God. As a servant of God, we are witnesses to the Gospel. . . to the truth and merits of Jesus’ death and resurrection. We’ve been given to share in the *divine mysteries* Jesus revealed to us. We’re called to share these mysteries so that those who believe will live by them.

Do each of us have the material possessions which we need? Do we desire to own more **things?** Do we spend without thinking, and do we worry about our material possessions? Many times we believe that owning much in the way of material things gives us status and worth. Jesus taught us that we cannot “be the slave of both God and money.” When we put our trust in material things, they become our gods.

Jesus teaches that all things belong to God and that people are more important than things. It is good to work for what we need and even for things to enjoy, but we must be careful not to let our money and possessions become our god.

Come to RCIA on Wednesday night to share your love for Jesus with all those preparing to receive sacraments. We meet from 7-9 pm in the religious education center.
