SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: "Behold, the Lamb of God," John the Baptist said and two of his disciples left to follow Jesus. Jesus then asked one of his probing questions: "What are you looking for?" As often happens in John's Gospel, the question does not get a direct answer. Their reply indicated they needed time with him: "Teacher, where are you staying?" Jesus' response was as open then as it is now: "Come and you will see." They stayed the day, and perhaps the night. Whatever was said, it was enough for Andrew to get his brother Simon the next day and take him to Jesus, who immediately changed his name. Encountering and spending time with Jesus usually brings change. At every Mass we hear "Behold, the Lamb of God" before receiving Communion. We can hear it as an invitation to stay with him, to listen for how he might speak to us, how he might name us: "Beloved," "Brother/Sister," "Friend," Disciple." Psalm 95 advises: "If today your hear his voice, harden not your hearts." Rather, follow the advice Eli gave Samuel and say, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

Are you willing to hear the Lord's voice? To tell him what you are looking for?

The theme for 2015 is *Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink."* (*John 4: 1-42*) What a wonderful opportunity to join Jesus and the Samaritan woman around the font of living water and give thanks for the grace that we all received in the waters of Baptism!



Become Holy Through the Mass is our teaching in RCIA on Wednesday. Based on the teachings from Jonah 3 and 1st Corinthians 7:29-31, we learn two different responses to the call of **God** to holiness. Jonah was called to preach to the Ninevites to turn from their evil ways. Jonah didn't want to do what God asked him and actually tried to run away but finally agreed to obey. The people responded to Jonah's call for conversion. . .they proclaimed a fast, they did penance and they *changed their evil ways*.

There is so much that all of us have to repent of:

poverty, homelessness, hunger, discrimination not standing up against drug abuse, against child abuse against sexual immorality, against domestic violence against people who graffiti other's property against corrupt officials in local, state and national government against our lack of growing in love and service to others.

Paul tells the Corinthians that *now* is the time for conversion, now is the time for repentance. In Mark's Gospel (1:14-20), Jesus continues proclaiming what John the Baptist taught: "This is the time of fulfillment. Reform your lives and believe in the Good News." Jesus was calling the disciples to follow him. Their response was **immediate and complete.** The disciples continued to learn Jesus' teachings and to follow him.

Once we make a choice for God, everything changes. . .we are changed, our thinking is changed, our habits change. Our attitudes and values might even be *radically* changed. We begin to make time for Scripture reading and study. We begin to be faithful about going to Confession and to Mass to receive Communion. We begin to desire only that which is good and holy and we make changes in our lives to reflect that desire.

We begin to see in the Mass the nourishment we need to **stay on track.** By living our Baptismal commitment to be united with Jesus, we continue to learn what his call for us means:

"Be holy, for I, the Lord, am holy." We see in the Mass our journey of salvation. We see in the Mass our practice for eternity!

Come to the Church's journey of faith through RCIA. We meet every Wednesday from 7-9 pm in the Religious Education Center and from 7-8:30 with children in one of the classrooms. RCIA is a preparation for receiving the Sacraments of the Church as well as a place where you can continue growing in your Catholic faith.


