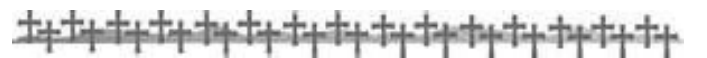

**FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME** : In the coming Sundays, we meet Jesus the storyteller, sowing his stories like good seed into our imaginations so they might bear fruit in our lives. The great artist Vincent Van Gogh made several paintings called *The Sower*, capturing how the sower vigorously spreads the seed. In Jesus' day, the land was first plowed and turned over, then the sower went forth and scattered the seed generously, tossing it with abandon. That is why it would land all over the place—on the footpath, on rocky ground, among weeds and on fertile land. Jesus continues to sow the seed of God's word, especially whenever we read or hear the scriptures. You might ask yourself: What kind of reception do I give the word of God? Then, consider each of the four places the seed lands. Or you could ask what word of God, what teaching of Jesus, has fallen on the footpath? What exhortation has fallen on rocky ground? Among weeds that choked it? On fertile land that produced fruit? **What word does Jesus call me to take more completely into my life? One calling for forgiveness, for justice, for peace-making, for loving another?**



*Optional memorial of Our Lady of Mount Carmel* — Since the 15th century, popular devotion of Our Lady of Mount Carmel has centered on the Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel also known as the Brown Scapular, a sacramental associated with promises of Mary's special aid for the salvation of the devoted wearer. Traditionally, Mary is said to have given the Scapular to an early Carmelite named Saint Simon Stock. The liturgical feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel is celebrated on July 16th.

**Prayer to Our Lady of Mount Carmel**

O most beautiful flower of Mount Carmel, fruitful vine, splendor of heaven,  
 Blessed mother of the Son of God, Immaculate Virgin, assist me in my necessity.  
 O, star of the sea, help me and show me herein, you are my mother.  
 Mary conceived without sin, pray for us who turn to you.

**RCIA** Just as rain and snow are vital to life when they fall upon the earth, life can't help but respond. Since this is true, how much more is God's word vital to life when we hear and proclaim it. His words WILL achieve their purpose; God promises that His word will bring us life. (Is. 55:10-11).

Romans 8:18-23 reminds us of our spiritual condition. We know and we've felt and we've lived life's struggles. Paul gives great dignity to all who believe by acknowledging that the Spirit which we have received as first fruits (like a promissory note) gives our efforts, our suffering and our weakness the SAME NOBILITY that we see in the sufferings of Christ.

With all the sadness and misery we face in our lives, we MUST live in hope—it can't be otherwise. You can't hope for something you already have, so we hope for what we can't see, and we do this in patient endurance just like the patient endurance of Jesus. IT IS THE SPIRIT who enables our hope.

In Matthew 13:1-9 (actually through verse 23), we are taught that despite all obstacles (rocky ground), the Word of God will bear fruit and will do so in amazing abundance. Jesus' own experience was the same. . .he had so many obstacles in his ministry. The fruits of his labor were bountiful beyond comprehension. Isaiah's prophesy from 55:10-11 is affirmed now in Matthew 13:1-9:

*“For as the rain and the snow come down from the sky and do not return before having watered the earth, fertilizing it and making it germinate to provide seed for the sower and food to eat, so it is with the word that goes from my mouth; it will not return to me unfulfilled or before having carried out my good pleasure and having achieved what it was sent to do.”*

So, to really think about today's teaching,

- How open am I to the Word of God?
- What kind of soil am I?
- How do I hear the gospel message and try to take it in for me personally?
  - \*reading, praying & meditating on scripture
  - \*accepting the challenge of scripture
- How have I experienced the Word of God taking affect in my life?
  - \*what is my story of growth
- What deters me from building up my relationship with Jesus?
  - am I so busy I don't take time for prayer and scripture daily?
  - do I lack trust in my faith journey?
  - do I have other “gods” which occupy my time?

Jesus gives us hope that our daily life has meaning when he is the most important part of our lives. Scripture teaches us to be a people of hope:

- 1 Tim. 5:5; 6:17—hope in God
- Heb 6:18-20—hope in Jesus
- Rm 4:18—Abraham as a model of hope
- Rm 5:2; Eph 1:18; Col 1:23—we are called to hope

We are sowers of the seed, so we must have hope. We share our hope with others by our life and we are touched by the hope-filled spirit of others.
