**SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:** We live in a world of opposites. We know what it means to speak and to hear truth or lies, to do good or evil, to behold beauty or ugliness. We can find these opposites in the world around us and within us. They are the fruit of our freedom. Jesus’ parables today all have to do with growth—of both wheat and weeds, of the mustard seed, and of dough that has been leavened. It is not difficult to apply the lesson learned from prematurely pulling up weeds and destroying the wheat. Jesus then reminds us that we can miss the Father’s active presence in the world, since it often begins as small as a mustard seed and as negligible as a pinch of leaven. But watch out, growth and expansion are on the way. Meanwhile, the challenge is to be as patient with others as God is and to persist in purifying our own hearts.

**What weeds are growing in your heart? Ask God to protect and increase the growth of the wheat.**



Feast of **St. James, apostle (died 44)** — On his day, Spain celebrates the feast day of its patron, St. James. There he is called *Santiago*. Centuries ago the Spaniards built a shrine in his honor at a place called Compostela. Pilgrims from all over Europe visited it. They wore in their hats the shell of a scallop or cockle. The shell recalled that, before he was called by Christ, James worked as a fisherman. It also reminded the pilgrims how in later years the apostle James baptized new Christians. Pilgrims wearing the shell were granted hospitality wherever they went. There were so many of them that James is considered the patron saint of pilgrims. James and his brother John (December 27) were the sons of Zebedee, a fisherman in Galilee. One day Jesus walked along the lake shore. Speaking to the brothers as they mended their nets, he invited them to come with him and learn to fish for human beings. Two men named James became apostles. Today’s James is called “James the Greater,” perhaps because we know more about him than about James the Less (May 3). Whatever the reason, the James we remember today seems to have been a person who earned the trust of Jesus. With John and

Peter, the gospels mention James as a witness to some of Jesus’ miracles, such as the cure of Peter’s mother-in-law and the raising of Jairus’s daughter. James also was present at the Transfiguration of Jesus (August 6). James was in the garden of Gethsemane on the night of the Last Supper. Oddly, though, the brothers James and John are often shown to be bull-headed. They didn’t understand that Jesus’ mission was one of humility and forgiveness. At one point Jesus gave the two brothers the nickname “sons of thunder” because they wanted to send lightning down on a town that turned them away. According to the 12th chapter of the Acts of Apostles, James was the first of the Twelve to be martyred. Arrested in Jerusalem by order of King Herod Agrippa, James was put to death with a sword.

**RCIA** “*Speak, Lord. Your Servant is Listening*” is our teaching in RCIA this Wednesday. It comes from next Sunday’s readings for the 17<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time. Those on the RCIA journey study Jesus’ teachings using a **Lectionary-based Catechesis**, the Church’s cycle of readings for each Sunday of the year. Each RCIA session, we study the Bible, the sacraments, the Church’s teachings handed down to us from the Apostles as well as the long tradition of the Church. We meet twice monthly during the summer from 7-8:30. We also meet with children who have not been baptized on the same schedule as RCIA.

Ever since the time of King David, there had been talk of the kingdom. Jesus made clear to his early followers *and to us* what the kingdom would be like. He used parables to help us understand what kind of kingdom he would bring. He spoke about:

- The bird nesting—representing a great world embracing all people
- The missing pearl—representing the treasures we uncover and changes which result
- The mustard seed—representing each small act of love we share with others
- The yeast—representing God’s power within us to spread the good news
- The weeds—representing what we need to get rid of which keeps us from Jesus.

Even though we see so much poverty and tragedy, so many natural disasters as well as so many people not following God’s commands, **He is in control**. Because we have been given free will, decisions we make or don’t make cause sadness and grief in our lives. God desires only good to come into our lives. **He is all good and all loving**. God is Lord over everything, but to belong to the kingdom, we have to experience interior change. We have to uncover the hidden treasure and “find the pearl.” This usually calls for sacrifices and changes we need to make in our lives.

When we submit and humble ourselves before God, we show our willingness to be guided by him. We give ourselves wholly to Jesus’ command to love one another. We imitate Jesus by following in his footsteps. We become persons of hope and justice. We try to be more patient with others. We use the power of the Holy Spirit within us to bring Jesus’ kingdom to fulfillment. We can tap into God’s power through prayer. Just like yeast in dough, God’s power is inside us and radiates outward. It is through using this power that the good news is able to be spread.

The kingdom is here now, but it will come to completion in heaven. Each small act of love and kindness we share will make a difference to someone. The kingdom of God began with only 12 disciples and has spread to billions throughout our world. Jesus asks us to share our treasures, our “pearls of great price” so that we can keep the faith alive and be able to renew in one another the life of the kingdom.

You are invited to come to RCIA to continue growing in your Catholic faith. Don’t allow yourself to stop growing. Our learning is life long and RCIA is a great way to continue studying Scripture. The Bible is Gods word to us and so it binds both the Church and each one of us.

The books of the Bible teach the truth which God intended for us to be taught “for the sake of our salvation” (Vatican II, Constitution of Divine Revelation).

Memorial of **Ss. Ann and Joachim** *parents of the Virgin Mary* — Like Mary and Joseph, and Elizabeth and Zechariah, they were *anawim*, the poor of Israel. Legends say that they dedicated their daughter to God, taking her to the Temple in Jerusalem when she was very young. A church in Israel named after St. Ann is believed by some people to be built over the place where Mary was born. Legends also say that, like Elizabeth and Zechariah, Ann and Joachim waited and prayed many years for the birth of a child. The name Ann is the English form of the Biblical name Hannah, which means “grace.” Stories about St. Ann remind us of the elderly prophetess Anna in Luke’s story of the Presentation of the infant Jesus in the Temple. They also remind us of Samuel’s mother Hannah, who in tears begged God for a child.

 Memorial of **St. Mary Magdalene** *disciple of the Lord (first century)* — Mary Magdalene stood at the foot of the cross on which Jesus poured out his blood. She came to his tomb with myrrh to embalm his body. And she was the first witness to the risen Christ. Mary was from Magdala, a town on the western shore of Lake Galilee. The Gospel of Luke says that Jesus healed her of physical and spiritual illness. Scenes from scripture make clear Mary Magdalene's intense devotion to Jesus. Mary continued to stay close to Jesus even when he was crucified. The Gospel of John names her as one of three women who stood by the cross. This took great courage. Chapter 20 of the Gospel of John tells us that Mary went to Jesus' tomb before dawn on Sunday morning. When she saw that the stone in front of the tomb had been rolled away, she thought the officials had stolen Jesus' body. She ran to tell the disciples. Then she returned to the tomb and wept. Angels appeared to her; then the risen Christ came and stood beside her. She did not recognize the Lord until she heard her name. Then she was asked to be the messenger of the good news. Mary Magdalene was the first to announce that Jesus Christ had conquered death. This is why Mary is call the "apostle of the apostles."
