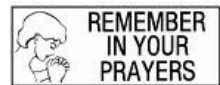

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT: God often works through human thirst. When the Israelites grew thirsty in the desert, they began to complain that Moses had led them out there to die. Not a little exasperated, Moses moved the complaint up the line to God, who had been directing the Exodus event from the beginning. To make the point that God can, does, and will provide, God has Moses tap water from a rock. The complaining stopped, for the time being. Thirst brought the Samaritan woman to a well at noon. She thought the only water she was going to get was what she could put in her bucket. Like the people in the desert, she found the rock of our salvation, waiting to slake her deepest thirst. The One who first asked her for a drink ended up being the source of living water, welling up to eternal life. This water was hers for the asking and she drank it in. Notice how she moves from seeing Jesus simply as a thirsty Jew, to acknowledging him as a prophet, to knowing him as the Messiah. In the end the entire village knows him as “the savior of the world.”

How can Jesus relieve your thirst?

RCIA RCIA will be attending the Mission beginning tomorrow through Thursday presented by Fr. Leandro Fazolini, a priest of the Sons of the Holy Family. The retreat is “*A Year of Faith, Yearning and Spiritual Growth.*” It will begin at 6 pm each evening. Confessions will be held at 5:30 pm.

What is a Mission? In the Northern churches of New Mexico, the local parish tries to provide a special *retreat* during Lent for its parishioners. It is an opportunity to *go away to a place of refreshment, reflection and prayer* so as to continue the journey of Lent with a stronger desire for acts of mercy toward others, fasting and deeper prayer and so that we may fully enter into the glories of Easter!

During Lent, we have heard from the Gospel of Matthew: the 1st Sunday recalls the temptations of Jesus. These temptations are focused on Jesus’ mission and the way that his mission will be accomplished. The devil tempts him to do it in ways contrary to what God wants. Jesus obeys God telling the devil that his mission is to do the will of God. We’re reminded that resisting temptation and remaining faithful was not easy for Jesus and it isn’t easy for us. We pray each time we are faced with temptation: “*Be with me Lord, when I am in trouble, be with me, Lord, I pray. Jesus, I trust in you.*”

The 2nd Sunday of Lent is the Transfiguration of Jesus. Jesus wanted to show his friends, us, his power and glory. He recognized that his apostles, at his impending death, would be confused. Jesus continues to be God and man. He allows us to carry our crosses so that we can say to him, “*I believe.*” Elijah and Moses speaking confirms our teaching that we continue to live eternally. Only those who are alive can converse. That’s why we pray for the dead because they are alive with God. The Transfiguration reveals the Glory of God as truth. The words heard by the apostles at the Transfiguration, “. . . *this is my beloved Son. . . listen to him*” is our gift from God teaching us that if we listen to Jesus, we will be guided rightly.

Today, the 3rd Sunday of Lent, we hear Jesus speaking to a Samaritan woman. This teaching is about new life, symbolized by the water which Jesus provides. The woman thinks of water as physical water which quenches thirst. Jesus is speaking symbolically to teach that the thirst it quenches is the deep spiritual thirst for eternal life.

Today our Elect and Candidates will go through the 1st Scrutiny. The emphasis on this Rite is on God’s might and protection and on the call of the Elect to Baptism. They, as well as ourselves, will be prayed over to be freed of any evil which will keep us from Jesus and to go through self-searching and repentance so that all that is weak, defective or sinful in us can be brought out and that all that is upright, strong and holy may be acknowledged.

THE SCRUTINY RITES: The word scrutiny means “search.” The Lenten scrutinies are rites of searching. They are meant to heal all that is weak or sinful in the hearts of the people chosen for baptism at Easter. These chosen people are called “the elect.” The scrutiny rites usually take place on the Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent. When the scrutiny rites are celebrated, on the Third Sunday of Lent we hear about the Samaritan woman who met and spoke to Jesus at a well. On the Fourth Sunday we hear about the cure of a man who was born blind. On the Fifth Sunday we hear about the raising of Lazarus from the dead. These stories are from the Gospel of John. Each story is about a “Passover”—from dishonesty to truth, from blindness to sight, from death to life. During a scrutiny rite, the elect step forward with their godparents. They bow their heads or kneel. Everyone in church prays for them. People ask God to give the elect a “sense of sin.” That’s a powerful gift—to know what sin is like, to understand the difference between good and evil. The Church prays that the elect will be free from Satan’s power. This prayer is called the exorcism. The church knows too well that evil has power. But we know also that Christ can free us from this power.
