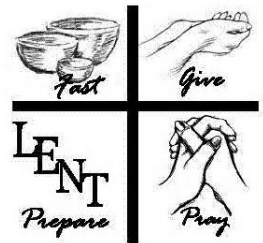

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT: Remember the Father’s words to the disciples after Jesus had been transfigured: “This is my beloved Son. Listen to him” (Mark 9:7). This week Jesus begins a three-Sunday “seminar” with us on the meaning of his upcoming death and resurrection. The next three Sunday Gospels will help us reflect on the mystery of Christ’s death on the cross. Today, after a dramatic visit to the temple where Jesus wreaks havoc by overturning the tables of both the moneychangers and those selling animals for sacrifice, Jesus speaks about what is going to happen to him in the future: “Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up.” He is speaking not about the temple of Jerusalem, where the people believed God dwelled, but the temple of his own body that would be destroyed by crucifying him on the cross. God’s dwelling place would no longer be a temple made of stone but the risen body of Christ and the body of his church. Paul calls Christ crucified the revelation of the power and wisdom of God.

Spend time this week meditating on how God redefines wisdom and strength though the cross.

CEMETERY NEWS: Many of our grave sites have been damaged due to water run off and we are trying to remedy this problem with several solutions. We have consulted with Robert Evans (pro bono). Solutions proposed require use of heavy equipment to move soil to build berms and we will also need cobble tones to fill drainage trenches. Your donations are needed and greatly appreciated. RCIA Today, our Elect (those chosen for Baptism at the Easter Vigil), and a few of our Candidates, will go through the Second Scrutiny. The emphasis on this Rite is on God’s might and protection and on the call of the Elect to Baptism. They will be prayed over to be freed of any evil which will keep them from Jesus as they go through self-searching and repentance. The Scrutiny, through our Priest’s prayer, allows all that is weak, defective or sinful in each of the Elect to be brought out and all that is upright, strong and holy to be acknowledged.

“*I Thirst For You,*” is a wonderful title for today’s Gospel as our Elect participate in the First Scrutiny. The people complained that they have been led out of slavery by Moses only to be forgotten by God in the desert. Israel had been thirsting for freedom, for liberation from captivity. Moses doesn’t lose faith in God, but asks him what he should do. Using the staff with which he struck the river, God instructed Moses to strike the rock and water would flow from it. Moses trusted God in an act of great faith. Through Moses, God quenched the thirst of the Israelites and revealed to them that he was indeed in their midst.

Jesus speaks to a Samaritan woman in today’s Gospel from Cycle A readings (which are always proclaimed during the 3rd, 4th and 5th Sundays of Lent). In Jesus’ time, the Jews and the Samaritans did not like one another nor did they speak to each other. Many cultural differences kept them apart. Also, a man wouldn’t have spoken to a woman who was a stranger, especially if she was by herself.

The woman thinks of water as the physical reality which quenches thirst. Jesus is speaking symbolically to teach her that the thirst which the water quenches is the deep spiritual thirst for eternal life. This teaching is about new life, symbolized by the water which Jesus gives us.

By the time John had written this Gospel at the end of the 1st century, AD, Jesus’ expected return was long overdue. The people were asking, “Where is he?” This was very much like the question the Israelites were asking Moses as they travelled through the desert “. . . is God in our midst or not?” John wrote to teach that Christ remains in our midst through the Church and through the Sacraments (LTP, 2011).

After Jesus and the woman end their conversation, she goes into town to tell everybody about Jesus. They go to meet him to see for themselves. They invite him to stay with them. They begin to believe in him because they heard him teaching. The woman at the well gave witness to others and brought others to know Jesus personally. Now they could say, “*We know that this is truly the savior of the world.*”

We know that Jesus truly is the savior of the world. He is Lord of life and death. We are blessed to experience our human life and to have faith in our eternal purpose. . . we know that when our earthly life is over, we have the promise of life forever with Jesus! Although we don’t know when we shall die, Jesus, through his one, holy and apostolic Church continues to offer us the gift of Catholic Christianity and a clear path for being ready when our death arrives. We are a sacramental Church, a church which is alive with Jesus’ very presence in each of the sacraments.

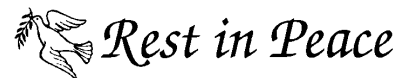

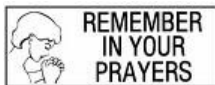
