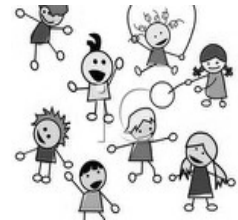

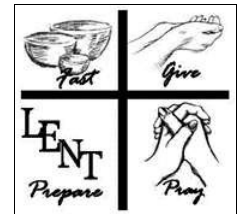

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT: Every Lent we go to the desert with Jesus to witness his being tempted by the devil. Going to the desert might not sound too appealing: hot during the day, cold at night, inhabited by rattlesnakes, tarantulas and scorpions. But lessons are learned there. God shaped the former slaves of Egypt into the people Israel during its forty years of wandering. And in the desert Jesus teaches us what it means to be God’s beloved child, as we witness his quick exchanges with the devil. Satan: “If you really are God’s child, use your power to feed yourself.” Jesus: “God’s word feeds me.” Satan: “If you are God’s child, jump and let God catch you.” Jesus: “I don’t test God.” Satan: “Worship me and I will give you this entire world.” Jesus: “I only worship God.” Jesus’ responses came from the book of Deuteronomy, part of the Torah, the law given to Moses expressing God’s covenant with Israel. Where Adam and Eve yielded to the temptation to be like God and Israel set up a golden calf to worship in place of God, Jesus put his trust in the Father.

How is God calling you to do the same?

Lent The days of Lent are often compared to a journey. That means that at the end of Lent we expect to find ourselves somewhere different than where we started. Every Lent we come back to our baptism. We struggle with the hard questions we were asked: Do you reject Satan? Do you believe in God? Do you believe in the church? At baptism, Christians take on three lifelong disciplines. These are prayer, fasting and almsgiving. They help us remain faithful to our baptismal promises. Each of these disciplines can take many forms. Prayer is communication with God. Fasting is self-denial, self-control, simple living. Almsgiving is giving to those in need. We share our goods, our money, or talents and time. These three disciplines function best when they are done together. They balance each other. The word itself, “discipline,” reminds us that we are “disciples” of Christ. Another word for prayer, fasting and almsgiving is “exercise.” Exercise does little good unless it’s done according to a schedule that we stick to. If we make excuses not to exercise, if we cheat on the program, then we won’t get results. The same can be said for prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Lent is the season to renew good ways to practice these three kinds of activity. Most Christians find that, in time, these three exercises transform their way of life. This is the season to turn away from our wanderings and to travel home to God.

RCIA Lent is the Church’s gift of grace which takes us back to our beginnings—our Baptism. Lent reminds us to focus on our ultimate journey in life, which is our journey to God in heaven. We begin our 40-day Lenten journey rejecting the devil, Satan, and all that he tries to entice us to. We affirm our belief in God by serving him and always putting him first in everything we do. It means praying and seeking ways to perform more works of charity. It means reaffirming our belief in Jesus as the Son of God who humbled himself to become one like us in every way but sin; Jesus, the one who suffered, died and rose from the dead *for us!* Lent calls us to be faithful to the Church Jesus established 2,000 years ago, the **one, holy, catholic and apostolic church**. Lent reminds us to honor the teachings of the Church as we faithfully attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days.

Peter, James and John were witnesses to the Transfiguration of Jesus, the experience of Jesus in all his glory. Jesus is changed in appearance, as he truly is. This moment becomes a time of promise for a future with God, with a blessing for then and now. A voice is heard by the three apostles, *“This is my beloved Son. Listen to him.”* Peter wants to “hold on” to this experience. He says, *Let us erect three booths here!* Peter wanted to hold on to the security he experienced in Jesus’ transfiguration.

Peter is not unlike us: we want and need security. Security gives us a feeling of being settled, being rooted. We seek security in our relationships, in our family life, in our prayer, in our church and in our God. But security can become distorted and can keep us from seeing beyond and continuing to grow in our faith.

Jesus is calling us, especially during this Lenten season, to “let go.” He wants to fill us with his grace which he allows to flow so abundantly in our lives. When we are able to let go of possessions, prestige, etc, we become aware of the many transfigurations which happen in our lives and in the lives of those around us. When we trust more in God than in our own possessions and securities, God is able to see that we trust in him to fill our needs. The grace to live a life without worry, trusting in God, is given to all of us who ask.

“Grace Poured Out” is our teaching in RCIA this Wednesday. Those preparing for reception of the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil were honored Sunday for their commitment to take seriously the call of Jesus in their study of the Catholic faith and will meet Archbishop Sheehan today at the Cathedral Basilica in Santa Fe. 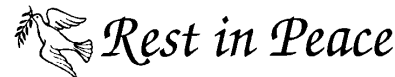
