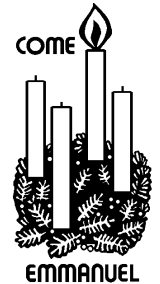

SOLIMNITY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE: This final Sunday celebration of the church year directs our attention to Jesus Christ as our king. We are to live anticipating the One who will return in glory, acting as a shepherd who will separate the lambs from the goats. Both the words of the sixth-century B.C. prophet Ezekiel and the imagery Jesus uses speak of a shepherd who will look after the sheep, seeking them out, rescuing those who were scattered, and pasturing them in a place of rest. We find Jesus portraying the end of time as an occasion of judgment. The outcome for us will be based on how we have met the most basic needs of others; their hunger, thirst, their need for care, their nakedness, whether they were sick or imprisoned. Those who receive the reward of eternal life from the shepherd are those who themselves have been a shepherd to others. The stakes are high; inheriting the kingdom or going off to eternal punishment. God’s will, as Paul reminds us, is that all who come from God will return to God. But we have a choice. **How do you shepherd those whom the Lord entrusts to your care?**

RCIA Families throughout our country will gather this Thursday to give thanks to God for so many blessings received. In 1623, Governor William Bradford of the Plymouth Colony, proclaimed a day of thanksgiving after the early colonists prayed for relief from a drought which was destroying their crops. . . rains began and a supply ship arrived with food. Thanksgiving was declared a national holiday by George Washington in 1789. This day was “to be devoted by the people of the States to the service of that great and glorious God. . .that we may then all unite in rendering unto Him our sincere and humble thanks.”

The Thanksgiving story is a story of endurance and the faith of our founding fathers. The Pilgrims managed to survive under extreme conditions with gratitude and hope. History teaches us that there were 18 women in the group who sailed to the new world. Only four of them survived that first winter. Out of 11 girls under the age of 17 who came, only nine survived. It was these 13 who prepared and served the first Thanksgiving to 90 Indian braves and 52 Pilgrims. The first Thanksgiving lasted three days.

Squanto’s story can be told during the Thanksgiving meal: Squanto was a Patuxet Indian. In 1614, he was taken as a slave to Spain by European fur traders who had come to the coast of the New World. While he was in Europe, he learned to speak English. By the time he was able to return to North America, he discovered that most of his tribe had died from sickness, including his parents, his wife and his children.

Because the Patuxet hated the white people, this was a blessing for the Pilgrims. The Pilgrims had lied and enslaved some of their people. If the tribe had remained, they would have attacked the Pilgrims. The Pilgrims settled in the abandoned Patuxet village and found corn left there, which kept the Pilgrims from starvation that first winter.

Squanto came that first Spring to greet the new people. He offered to help them learn about planting and crops. He lived with the Pilgrims his entire life. He taught the Pilgrims about growing pumpkin, corn, beans and potatoes.

How does the Church celebrate? Each Sunday as we gather around the table of the Lord for Holy Eucharist—the Lord’s Supper, we offer thanks. So, not only on Thanksgiving Day, our National Holiday, do we give thanks, but we offer thanks at every Sunday and Holy Day Mass. St. Paul constantly urges us to “be thankful” and “give thanks.” Paul believed that our days can be filled with expressions of thanks to God—for friends near and far, for food, for victory over death, for “all circumstances”—for everything!

St. Paul knew how deep humankind could sink, but he was so sure of the transforming power of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, that he was “bursting” with thankfulness and urges us to be like him!

In times of war and rumors of war, unemployment, sickness, death, he urges us to keep our eyes on Jesus so that we can deal with our worries and fears. *“Just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness.”*(his letter to the Colossians 2:6-7)

How does the world celebrate Thanksgiving? By “hyping up” sales flyers urging us to shop for Christmas on Thanksgiving and on “Black Friday.” Even that designation for Friday sounds ominous! **SPEND BEAUTIFUL TIME WITH YOUR FAMILY INSTEAD! GET TO KNOW YOUR ELDERS IN THE FAMILY. INVITE SOMEONE WHO MAY BE ALONE TO YOUR THANKSGIVING CELEBRATION! HAPPY THANKSGIVING TO EACH OF YOU FROM RCIA.** RCIA will not meet this Wednesday as we celebrate with our families.
