Congratulations to Jessica Pacheco recipient of a full paid scholarship to attend the “2014 Music Ministry Summer Institute” at St. Catherine University, St. Paul, MN.

The Archdiocese of Santa Fe was awarding a full scholarship to one youth in the Archdiocese of Santa Fe which would include registra-

tion, meals, housing, and airfare. (It turned out later, that two full scholarships would be awarded.) Out of ten applicants, Jessica Pacheco was awarded one of them. Jessica is the daughter of Larry and Susan Pacheco of Chamita, a senior at Espanola Valley High School, a registered parishioner of Santa Cruz Parish, pianist and vocalist at the 7pm Teen Mass and was a student of Holy Cross Catholic School.

Jessica went to St. Catherine University for five days this summer to have one of the best experiences of her life. Jessica shares that, not only was she pushed to be a better musician but her heart was ignited with the flame of Holy Spirit and the unconditional love of God. “What I loved most about the people at MMA was the peace and acceptance they would bring to everyone, no matter where we were all from.” “There was such a thing as immediate friendship and respect and it made me wish the entire world was like that, living truly as brothers and sisters.” “We had daily prayer every morning which was the best way we could have started the day.” “It made me snap and realize that when we gather to pray, we gather to pray together as one rather than just one individual amongst many.” “That’s what music ministry is all about.” **“It’s about bringing the church altogether in prayer as one but through music.”** “At MMA you could have the most incredible voice or the best instrumental skills on the planet and it still wouldn’t amount to half as much as it would if you didn’t use your gifts to fully surrender them up to the one who gave them to you in the first place.” “I was asked to bring more music ministers, youth as well as adults, next year and I hope to be able to fulfill that wish.” “God willing there will be more New Mexican ministers in Minnesota next year.” “Anyone considering to go to MMA, sign up right away, there’s absolutely nothing to lose and everything to gain.”

“I thank everyone who helped me get to Minnesota.” “You have greatly impacted my life and I’m forever thankful to you for that.”

FEAST OF THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA: It may seem strange to celebrate the dedication of some church over in Rome, but the Basilica of Saint John Lateran is the pope's cathedral as bishop of Rome. Built on land owned by the Laterani family, Pope Sylvester I dedicated it on this date in 324 A.D. It has been called "the mother and head of all churches of Rome and in the world." It was first dedicated to the Savior, then later to Saint John the Baptist. Our readings can apply to all churches throughout the world. The prophet Ezekiel speaks of life-giving water that flows out from the temple in Jerusalem, symbolizing the waters of Baptism that flows from the church. Jesus refers to his own body as the new life-giving temple that is the dwelling place of God, one that God will raise up at the Resurrection. And Paul proclaims the community at Corinth as God's building, God's temple, whose foundation is Christ, in which the Spirit swells. All of this points to our identity as baptized Christians. We, as a people, are the living stones that are God's dwelling place in the world. **What does being a part of God's temple mean to you?**

RCIA

“*Social Justice. . . A Catholic Christian’s Responsibility*” is our teaching in RCIA this Wednesday. Every week we study the Gospel message to understand Jesus’ call for us to follow him each day of our lives. We invite adults who wish to prepare to receive sacraments in the Church to come to RCIA. We also invite adults who want to study the Bible with RCIA journeyers to come any Wednesday for an evening of learning and sharing the faith with other adults. We meet from 7-9 pm in the Religious Education Center where we also have sessions for children ages 3-13 whose parents wish them to prepare for Baptism. Mary Ann Vigil is the Catechist.

The Gospel parable for Matthew 25:14-30 concerns a man leaving his property for his servants to take care of. He is trusting them to do well for him. What is Jesus teaching **us** in this parable? God, our master, has left **us** to take care of the earth and each other wisely. He has provided us with such abundance from that which the earth produces. God has created the land so that *life* can be sustained on it. What are some of the things we have done to destroy this gift which God has given us?

Of all the resources we have, water and the land have given us so much. Yet, we have wasted water, polluted our rivers and oceans, eroded our land, overcut our trees(most notably in the South American Andes Mountains), strip-mined (and now use fracking to develop more places to get oil) and left the lands with poisonous waste. Our air has become smog filled in the larger cities of the world. Plants which once graced our earth cannot really grow anymore. Many of the animals God gave us are now extinct or in danger of extinction.

How have we used the gifts God has given us?

In our families—Do we use our gift of listening?

Do we try to understand and answer our family member’s needs?

In our schools or work—Do we use our ability to act for the greater good?

Do we try to work hard and ethically to be good examples?

In our Parish—Do we follow our baptismal call to gather and pray as a community?

Do we celebrate joyfully at Sunday Mass?

Do we share our time, talent and money to enliven our Church?

In creation—Do we respect nature (no littering, dumping trash in arroyos, etc.)?

Do we respect each other’s property?

Do we mend and fix things which are broken or just buy more stuff?

The U.S. Bishops, in their teaching document, *Renewing the Earth*(1991) wrote:

“Men and women bear a unique responsibility under God to safeguard the created world and by their creative labor even to enhance it. Safeguarding creation requires us to live responsibly within it, rather than manage creation as though we are outside it. The human family is charged with preserving the beauty, diversity and integrity of nature as well as fostering its productivity.”

We pray each Sunday at Mass for the time when **Jesus will come again**. We’re called to use our work on earth to make our world beautiful as we prepare for Jesus’ second coming.

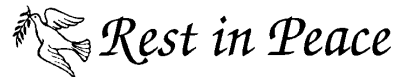
