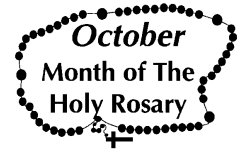

**TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:** Many kings of antiquity insisted on being called divine, in direct opposition to Israel’s first commandment. Even so, God was not fussy about making use of someone like Cyrus, king of Persia, as one “called by name” to do God’s will for the sake of Israel. Cyrus gave permission for the Jews to return and rebuild Jerusalem and the Temple. So God can work even in the realm of politics. The Pharisees and the Herodians are trying to trap Jesus with their question about paying taxes. Saying yes would lose favor with the people; saying so could lead to a charge of treason. A Roman coin would have the emperor’s image on it with an inscription claiming divinity. No devout Jew would carry one. Jesus scores his first point when he receives one from his questioners. And he slips out of their trap by advising them to pay back to the emperor what bears his image, but to return to God what bears the diving image, that is, themselves—heart, mind and spirit.

**RCIA** “Love of Neighbor.....Imitating Christ Through Grace” is our teaching in RCIA this Wednesday. We have learned that the greatest commandment given us by Jesus himself is: *You shall love the Lord your God with your whole heart*, and he added, *You shall love your neighbor as yourself*. Later on in Scripture, Jesus tells us, *You shall love one another as I have loved you*.

Jesus teaches us that to follow him means we must obey these commandments if we are to be true followers of Jesus. The way we know we love God is in the way we treat our neighbor.

Loving our neighbor means more than just being kind to our family and friends.....those who are most closely connected to us. It means do right *by widows or orphans*:

- making sure that the hungry are given food to eat
- that we work to find shelter for the homeless or help them in some **real** way
- that the unemployed not suffer from lack of resources to help them find work
- that the poor have their basic needs met
- that the elderly are well taken care of
- that the young are well educated
- that the lonely are paid attention to.....

We have to expand our definition of **neighbor** and our relationships with and responsibilities toward others. This is the true meaning of these commandments: *“The commandments to love God with all one’s heart and to love one’s neighbor as oneself are the heart and soul of Christian morality.....these commands point out the path toward true human fulfillment and happiness. They are not arbitrary restrictions on human freedom. Only active love of God and neighbor makes the fullness of community happen. Christians look forward in hope to a true communion among all persons with each other and with God. (US Bishops, Economic Justice for All)*

The only time Jesus speaks of judgment in Scripture is in Matthew 25: *When I was hungry, you gave me to eat; when I was thirsty you gave me to drink. When I was naked you clothed me, in prison and you visited me.....* Jesus teaches us that we aren’t only to think of ourselves and our immediate family. He reminds us that we are part of **God’s family** and because we are so intimately connected, we have to look after one another’s needs. Jesus insists that the whole law and teaching of the prophets hangs on these two commandments of love.

It’s so easy to follow these two commandments....love God and love his people. This isn’t hard decision making. Every decision we make has to be done in the light of whether it will help us love God and his people more. When we live in imitation of Christ, our actions become visible. Faith calls for the response of choosing to act like Jesus in the will of the Father.
