

THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: At a time of much discussion about the reform of immigration laws, the reading from Exodus calling Israel to treat foreigners kindly, remembering they were once aliens in the land of Egypt, challenges us today. God continues to hear the cry of those who have come to a land not their own. And in our time when a few amass great wealth at the expense of the most vulnerable, we overhear God's word calling Israel to be compassionate, as God has been to them. Paul too holds us generosity, praising the Thessalonians who "became a model for all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia." The Thessalonians gave witness to the gospel by their charitable lifestyle, even in a time of suffering. Jesus stands between Moses and Paul, holding out to us the two great commandments: love God and love your neighbor as yourself. It has been said that the art of giving and receiving love is at the heart of growing old gracefully. One can begin to do this early on, placing this fine art at the heart of growing up and maturing into a true human being. Who needs your love most at this time?

"Communion of the Saints and Our Belief About Purgatory" is our teaching in RCIA this Wednesday by our Catechist, Gene Montoya. Many young people have as their heroes movies stars, singers, sports figures and others. Many of these "heroes" are to be admired for the talent they possess. We've all had heroes from movies, literature, government, from out towns and cities. More often than not, our heroes were people we hadn't even met, but somehow we were inspired by the work they did. These heroes and heroines touched us and sometimes, even helped us for our lives and gave us vision.

If we aren't careful, our heroes can become our idols in ways that are not healthy. We don't take into account their own expression of humanity and how they are living their lives. Sometimes our concept of their influence becomes distorted and we can lose sight of how they contribute to human living and to our own lives. Being fully human, our heroes experience pain and doubt, make mistakes and have feelings just like we do. What really makes a person heroic is that they choose to live life more profoundly using the gifts they have been given in making our world a better place.

The Church celebrates heroes and heroines on a special day each year. The Feast of All Saints on November 1 is followed by the Feast of All Souls on November 2. These are celebrations of men and women who chose to live their lives using their talents and gifts to respond to God. The Church calls these men and women saints because they were holy, they loved Jesus above all, and they brought others to him. They faithfully lived their ordinary lives in a Gospel way of life. They were sinners who found forgiveness. They struggled and had darkness in their lives, but, in the end, they reached for Jesus, the light who would always guide them back to him. They carried their cross daily and allowed God to change them. They were ordinary men and women like us and they believed that the cross of Jesus Christ made all the difference!

We are all called to be saints, to be holy, to make a difference in a world which views amusing ourselves over sacrificing for others. Jesus gives us the way to become true followers of his way, his truth, his life and his light. We find this way of living in the Beatitudes. The Bible shows us that we have community with the saints. We are "citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ *Jesus himself as the cornerstone*" (Eph 2:19-20)

Purgatory is a temporary state of purification for the imperfect saints. The souls of the just who have died in the state of grace but with venial sins or reparation due for forgiven mortal and venial sins are fully cleansed in Purgatory so that they may enter heaven. In Purgatory, all remaining reparation for sin is made; all remaining self-love is purged and purified until only love of God remains. (San Juan Catholic Seminars)

In Matthew 12:32 the Church's doctrine on Purgatory is made clear: "Whoever speaks a word against the Son of Man will be forgiven, but whoever speaks against the Holy Spirit will not be forgiven, either in this age or in the age to come. Jesus implies that some sins can be forgiven in the next world. Any remission of sin in the next world can refer only to Purgatory since sin cannot be forgiven in heaven or in hell. In 2 Maccabees 12:44-46 it reads, "For if her were not expecting the fallen to rise again, it would have been useless and foolish to pray for them in death. But if he did this with a view to the splendid reward that awaits those who had gone to rest in godliness, it was a holy and pious thought. Thus he made atonement for the dead that they might be freed from this sin."
