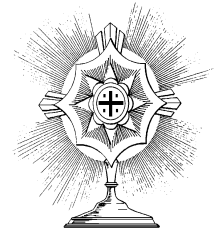

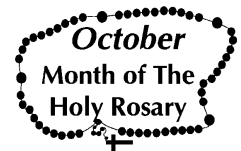

TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Just because great care has gone into something does not mean things will work out well—whether that “something” is a project, a party, or a relationship. The weather of the season or of the heart can undo our best effort or intention. The prophet Isaiah sings a song about a vineyard, so carefully tended by its owner, but yielding only wild grapes. Jesus tells a tale of a vineyard, also carefully planted and protected, that is entrusted to tenants whose greedy hearts lead them to violence and murder. In both instances, this is the story of God and Israel, though Jesus takes aim especially at the religious leaders so resistant to how God is working in Jesus himself. God’s desire is that we bear fruit in our lives and taking to heart Paul’s words to his beloved Philippians, that we be true and honorable, just and pure, bringing beauty and grace into the world. God expects a return for the love so lavishly given to us. Christ is the vine and we are the branches, cultivated through the working of the Holy Spirit.

Where do you find an invitation to be fruitful in your life?

RCIA “*Living Out Our Faith*” is our teaching in RCIA on Wednesday. We meet from 7-9 pm each week in the Religious Education Center. Our children’s RCIA meets from 7-8:30 on the same evening. We meet to prepare adults for Baptism in the Catholic faith. We also prepare Catholics to receive Confirmation and First Communion. Renewal of faith is also part of our RCIA journey of faith.

We are aware of how generous God is to us. He invites all of us, those who are good and those who are not so good, the loving and those who are not so loving. God invites all of us and we haven’t earned the right to his generosity, but he lavishes his love on everyone.

How do we respond to his amazing love for us? Do we accept it or do we refuse it? Sometimes we busy ourselves so much with our work and play that we do not have time for others. Someone asks us to talk with them, but we put them off for a later time. Someone asks us for help, but we have no time for them because we have other commitments. When we live a life that is self-centered, thinking only of what we need or of the things we have to accomplish, we fail to respond to the needs of God’s people. We need all our time and energy for ourselves (Gaynell, Cronin).

Jesus, in the Gospel of Matthew 22, teaches us about the invitation by a king to his son’s wedding banquet and the refusal of invited guests to attend. There is a song related to this scripture: “*I cannot come to the banquet, don’t trouble me now. I have married a wife, I have bought me a cow. I have fields and commitments that cost a pretty sum. Pray hold me excused I cannot come.*”

Those inviting the people symbolize the prophets and preachers and they are rejected. So they are ordered to the edge of town to bring anyone they could find to attend the banquet—the bad as well as the good. Jesus teaches this parable to show that those to whom the invitation was given rejected it and **their places have been taken by others.**

How are we preparing for the banquet Jesus invites us to? The kingdom of God has been prepared **and it is coming.** Those who refuse to come are closed-minded, full of oppressive attitudes, full of discrimination and the belief that only with violence can problems be solved. They are those who don’t forgive and sometimes see themselves as better than others.

There are also those who love God so much and this love is expressed as an eagerness to do good for others. They live lives of love, forgiveness and generosity. They are those who are ready to listen to others, the ones who offer to help a neighbor or friend or stranger in need. They are the ones who lovingly care for their elders, for those who need help. They are the ones who help work in shelters and soup kitchens, who volunteer in church or school youth programs. They are the ones who run for political office to try to make a better world for people in their community and state and country. They are not self-seekers. Jesus invites US! “***I request the honor of your presence in the kingdom of God!***”

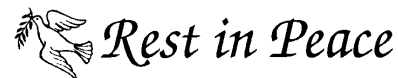
