FEAST OF THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS: God might seem petulant to become so upset with the Israelites' complaining about food that serpents are sent to kill them. But it wasn't the food as much as the accusation that God had brought them out into the desert to die. God had saved them from Pharaoh's army, liberated them from slavery, shown them signs and wonders by sending manna in the desert and causing water to flow from a rock. Now they were saying this God who wanted life for them had led them out to the desert to die! No wonder God's anger flares. But it fades just as quickly when the people repent. The very thing that brought death becomes a symbol of life. If they look at the bronze serpent lifted up, they will be saved. This story prepares us for Jesus' words in today's Gospel. God will take another symbol of death, the cross, and transform it into an expression of divine love for all of us.

RCIA St. Matthew’s theme in his 20th Chapter has to do with *justice, charity, mercy and forgiveness*. In this Gospel, Jesus helps us to understand his generosity. He offers us the free gift of salvation and teaches us we cannot earn it. “Justice and charity are closely related to generosity through mercy and forgiveness. These are the foundations of peace, but sometimes we want the result without the foundation”(E.S. Lilly).

In the early 40’s through the mid-60’s when people visited each other more, the Hispanic culture was such that people would visit someone but could not easily accept their invitation to stay for dinner. It was considered impolite, because those invited often felt they were imposing and they even thought they might not be able to reciprocate. Also, when gifts were given, those receiving felt they were now obligated to buy a gift in return.


As time has progressed, there doesn’t seem to be such a feeling of imposition and people are more able to receive a gift with thankfulness and gratitude. Although there are some people who have more difficulty in receiving than in giving, people are more able to receive and accept gifts as well as compliments and even charity from others with a deeper understanding of the heart of the giver.

For all of us, it is so important to think about how generous God is to us and how much we depend on his presence in our lives—how much we need his grace. He calls us to be open always to offering whatever we can to others, especially to those who have most need. Justice and charity go hand in hand. St. Ignatius Loyola describes for us the attitude we need to have which will please Jesus:

*Take, Lord, and receive all my liberty, my memory, my understanding and my entire will.
All that I have and possess, you have given all to me. To you, Lord, I return it.
All is yours. Dispose of it wholly according to your will.
Give me your love and your grace for this is enough for me.*

When Jesus told his disciples the Parable of the Laborers in the Vineyard, he wasn’t giving them a lesson on economics. He was teaching them, and us, about God’s love and generosity. He was teaching us all about his love for all his people. The basic point of this parable is God’s generosity—he’s teaching us how God’s economy of salvation works, not how to manage the economy. He’s really teaching us that he is offering salvation to all of us—whether we are life-long Catholic Christians or newly brought into the faith. Salvation is a gift of *grace*, not a reward for length of service.

RCIA, the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, meets every Wednesday from 7-9 pm in the Religious Education Center. It is a journey of faith for those who want a closer relationship with Jesus as they prepare to receive the Sacraments.
