**TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:** Doing “yes” trumps saying “yes”! The prophet Ezekiel was something of a “strange bird,” usually acting out his parables rather than talking them out. But here he is as straight forward as can be: Turning away from virtue brings death. Turning away from wickedness brings life. We find this theme of actions having consequences also in today’s parable. Jesus holds a mirror up to the chief priests and elders who were so critical of tax collectors and sinners. But this group of disreputable people heard and responded to John the Baptist’s call to conversion. Not so the “official” (and self-appointed) religious people. Jesus is our model for self-emptying for he sake of others, even to the point of death. By both his birth and his dying on the cross, Christ gave himself up for us and for the life of the world. For this reason Paul calls the Philippians (and us) to have that same mind and attitude that was in Christ, humbling ourselves and looking out for the interests of others. The best course is to bring “saying yes” and “doing yes” together.

**What makes it hard to move from saying yes into doing yes?**

*My sheep hear my voice, says the Lord; I know them, and they follow me. (John 10:27)*

# RCIA

“*Hope of the Harvest. . .the Kingdom of God*” is our teaching on Wednesday in RCIA. People throughout the Espanola Valley, Chimayo, Pojoaque and Santa Cruz are coming to the end of the harvest of their crops: chili, corn, cucumbers, tomatoes, zucchini. . .so it would be easy to relate this event to the teaching of Jesus that the kingdom of God is at hand. The signs of the kingdom are the rich harvest, the abundant yield.

We, as Catholic Christians, believe that our Lord is present **in his word** and **in the blessed Eucharist** we receive each time we are present at Mass. We believe that Jesus is present with us **when two or more of us gather in his name**. We also believe that Jesus is present with us **every moment of every day**—he promises us, “*Why do you worry? Do you not know that I care for you even as I care for the lilies of the field and the birds of the air?*” And, his promise, “*I will be with you to the end of time.*”

We believe God created us to be obedient to his will. We need to pray daily for all those things we are thankful for. We experience signs of the kingdom when we experience and see good relationships, peace within and among families and nations, growth in our lives, a sense of community in our church and in where we live, sharing among people, serving those in need, taking responsibility for our actions. . .

We know that the kingdom of God is not yet fulfilled. We are struggling with warring among nations, with the possibility of taking part in combatting a serious threat to stability in Middle Eastern nations, the destructive threat Ebola is posing to our African brothers and sisters, economic problems, destruction of family life and values and so many divisions in our government. Our baptismal faith is not being lived as we promised although to live this faith would bring great dignity to us as children of God, brothers and sisters of Jesus himself.

So, in our lives today, we experience both living in the kingdom now and very aware of its absence. One of the greatest virtues we have as Catholic Christians is the virtue of HOPE!

We place our hope in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. People who have all they need sometimes feel they have no need for hope. We hope regardless of our circumstances or the concern for what’s happening in our world. . .because our hope is centered in JESUS!!

Please come to RCIA this Wednesday. We meet from 7-9 and invite not only those who would like to receive the sacraments of the Church, but also those who want to grow in their knowledge and love of Jesus Christ. Any adult who would like to join our Sponsor Ministry is invited to come to RCIA. Please call the number in the bulletin to offer your help. WE NEED YOU!!!

We also have an RCIA journey of faith for children who have not been baptized and whose parents or guardians would like them to learn the teachings Jesus himself gave us. We meet with the children Wednesdays from 7-8:30 pm.
