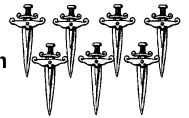

Welcome Iglesia de Santa Cruz de la Canada, priests, sister, parishioners, and staff welcome all those that are visiting our church as well as our newly registered families: . May your life be touched, and inspired as we give praise and worship to Our Lord through the power of Holy Spirit. Welcome!

TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: All three readings remind us that we are our brothers’ and sisters’ keeper. This means not only reaching out to those in need, but also pulling them back from doing harm. God called Ezekiel to be the watchman for the house of Israel, speaking out to “turn [the wicked] from [their] way.” The words of Paul remind the Romans that the only debt they should have is to love one another, adding that love does no evil to the neighbor. These words can be heard as referring only to individual relationships. The fourth great speech of Jesus in Matthew’s Gospel, however, concerns the community, particularly its responsibility to confront a wrongdoer. First, one tries to persuade on a one-to-one basis, but if that fails, take another one or even two with you. And if that fails, get the community involved. Jesus’ final words can sound as though a time might come to cut a wrongdoer off. But remember that tax collectors and sinners were the very ones for whom Jesus came. The Christian community is never to give up on one another.

Have you ever needed help in changing your ways? Does anyone need your support to change?



Feast of The Holy Cross — Many writers of the church have reflected on the meaning of the cross on which Jesus died. A sign of shame has become a sign of honor. In dying on the cross, Jesus became one with the poorest, the outcast, the least among us. We Christians make the sign of the cross when we enter or leave a church, when we eat our meals, when we go to sleep at night and when we awake in the morning. The cross is our protection in danger and a constant reminder of God’s love. Before we were baptized, we were marked with the sign of the cross. That stamped each of us as a Christian. The feast of the Holy Cross began in the year 335, when churches in Jerusalem, built on the sites of the crucifixion and resurrection of Christ, were dedicated.

RCIA

“The Cross is evil at its worst and Goodness at its best. . .The Christ without the Cross cannot save. . .Most lives are frustrated because they have left out the Cross. . .the sight of a crucifix has a continuity with Golgotha; at times its vision is embarrassing. . .it makes us feel involved. . .”(Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen).

It is something common to all Christian beliefs that we base our religion on an instrument of execution. . .an instrument which was meant to mete out the cruelest suffering and most humiliating death to the people considered the lowest of the low. And what do we do with that sign. . .

- a. we trace it over our bodies whenever we pray
- b. we trace it over our bodies when we pass in front of a Catholic Church
- c. we hang crosses on our walls
- d. we wear jewelry shaped like a cross

So, we are a religion of the cross and everything this cross stands for. We face suffering and death remembering Jesus’ words, *“Whoever wants to be my disciple must take up his cross **daily** and follow after me.”* We remember that suffering and death leads to salvation and resurrection.

We can be people who are humiliated by others, but we know Jesus is with us and we know we walk with Jesus who lifts us up in our humiliation. We know that every time we are put down, Jesus lifts us up through our faith in him. . . *“When I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw all men to myself, says the Lord.”*

People in our times who are considered the lowest of the low are here so that we can embrace them as *other Christs*. We have the most beautiful example of how loving those who are in slums and in despair were cared for by Mother Teresa (now, Blessed Teresa of Calcutta). We have so many missionaries who devote their lives helping the poorest of the poor. . .who are “other Christs” to those who have no one.

We have shelters, soup kitchens and nursing homes which offer us an opportunity to be “other Christs” to those suffering and in need. We have neighbors who are elderly who can’t do every- day chores whom Jesus is calling us to, to let our lives of belief in the cross, the sign of our salvation, shine in helping them.

The Church’s feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross celebrates the dedication of the church erected by Emperor Constantine over the site of Christ’s crucifixion, Calvary. It has been celebrated by all Christian communities, Eastern and Western, for over 15 centuries.

We invite you to RCIA this Wednesday to grow in the riches and the knowledge and the glory of Christ. We meet from 7-9 pm every week in the Religious Education Center.
